POLIO MESSAGE FOR PARENTS

Early in May you will receive from the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis a sufficient supply of their pamphlet entitled, "Polio Message for Parents," so that each child in your district may be given one by his teacher to take home.

We are now in a period of critical significance in the control of polio and there is a tremendous educational problem facing the authorities, particularly the State Health Department and the Virginia Medical Society. Any assistance you can render through the widespread distribution of this folder will help in a very positive manner.

SUBJECT: "LEARN TO SWIM" PROGRAM

Again, as in the past three summers, the State Department of Education and the American Red Cross, are cooperating in a state-wide "Learn to Swim" program. As the result of this cooperation more than 40,000 children in Virginia participated with approximately 20,000 receiving certificates.

Through the continued cooperation of schools and local chapters of the American Red Cross, it is hoped that swimming and water safety instruction will be provided in every locality where facilities and competent training personnel are available.
