

1. "In 1942-43 Pay Colored Teachers on the basis of the schedule for white teachers, less ten per cent."

2. "In 1943-44 Pay Colored Teachers on the basis of a single salary schedule for white and colored teachers."

3. "It is proposed that the salary of the high school principal shall be adjusted in 1941-42 by agreement; in 1942-43 90% of the schedule for white principals, and in 1943-44 on the basis of a single salary schedule for white and Colored high school principals."

4. "No proposal is made in reference to the salary of the colored supervisor for the reasons that no schedule exists for the salaries of these positions, that heretofore the State Board of Education has followed the practice of paying $\frac{2}{3}$ of the salaries, that the exact salary will probably continue to be one determined by individual agreement, and that this salary will depend upon the number of teachers to be supervised as well as other factors. The board affirms its acceptance of the principle that no distinction shall be made after September 1943 in the salary of a supervisor on account of race or color and that intermediate adjustments shall be made to conform approximately to the adjustments proposed for teachers."
