Objects of the Organization. In their application to General Miles for a charter these ladies stated: "We have organized a command of ladies as an auxillary to your organization for the purpose of building up the various commands, in aiding the members in relief work, and, in general, to be interested workers with your organization." As there was no provision in the constitution of the National Army, Spanish War Veterans, for chartering auxiliary bodies, Jeneral Miles postponed action on the apdication until the following general assemoly at Buffalo. In the meantime a meetng of the national council of administraion, held in Brooklyn, recommended that
