LOUDOUN COUNTY.

Two new two-room school-houses were completed this fall in Loudoun, one at Leithton and the other at Waters. Each building replaced an antiquated one-room building. The name of the Waters school has been changed to Emerick.

Rural supervision is proving very popular in four of our rural districts this year. The supervisor, Miss Lucy Duncanson, has about 28 teachers in the white one and two-room schools of the four districts. The open weather and the use of an automobile has enabled her to spend a great deal of time with her teachers. Our boards made arrangements to have a supervisor in charge of the one and two-room schools of the other two rural districts, but a supervisor could not be found.

A colored supervisor¹ is working in Loudoun for the first time.

Besides the annual institute which was held just before the opening of our schools, one general county meeting of teachers has been held.

Loudoun county's first teacherage is now about completed. This is a six-room house located on the grounds of the Lovettsville high school.
