# School Board To Study New Plant Needs

The Loudoun County school board will meet in special session at 7 p. m. November 17 to discuss school building needs.

This meeting is scheduled in advance of the panel discussion on school buildings which will be held at Loudoun high on November 24.

The school board on Tuesday voted to pay \$150 in expenses for up to three persons who might attend a meeting of the Southern Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges which will be held in Louisville, Ky., in December. At that time Loudoun high school will be up for regional accreditation.

The three who were suggested to attend the meeting are superintendent C. M. Bussinger, director of instruction Caleb J. Gibson and principal D. Harold Knott.

Mrs. Catherine J. Ray was appointed clerk in the principal's office at Aldie.

Marvin Hurt was appointed janitor at Douglass elementary school at \$200 per month.

Miss Malinda Trittpee, secretary in the superintendent's office, was appointed a notary public.

## Use Available Space, School Heads Urge

Lovettsville school board member Miss Freida Johnson on Tuesday gave a report of the annual meeting of the school board association in Richmond which she attended as a representative of the Loudoun board.

Miss Johnson said that speakers at the meeting stressed the use of all available space in the school buildings. They pointed out that halls, wall space, ceilings, floor space and auditoriums should be used whenever possible.

She said that one speaker brought out the idea that summer schools should be used for those who want to add another subject and not only for those

who failed a subject during the past year.

Another idea advanced was that the whole school program should not be sacrificed for scientific subjects but that cultural subjects should also be stressed.

Also that a place should be found for every pupil in school and not only for the one above average intelligence.
