The winner of the northern Virginia Finals automatically secures a cash prize of \$100 and a place in the Washington Star Area Finals of the contest, to be held in Washington during the morning of May 10th.

The winner of the championship of the Washington Star Area will secure a cash prize of \$200 and a place in the National Finals, to be held in Washington on the evening of May 21st.

By participating in the National Finals, a speaker automatically becomes entitled to a Summer tour of Europe, with all expenses paid, and also has a chance to win the National Championship Cup.

The winner of the Natio nal Championship of the United States will the be a representative of this country in the International Finals, to be held in Washington in October, at which time the representatives of the leading countries of North and South America and Europe will be represented and the grand trophy will be a magnificent loving cup.
