I very strongly feel that the Southern Planter is an excellent magazine and one that has published many of our articles, and I earnestly ask your consideration of participation. It is my understanding that additional information will be sent to you.

VI. FARM MACHINERY REPAIR CLASSES

I am enclosing application for state funds to pay instructional costs of farm machinery repair classes. The same policies as last year still hold good. One instructor for classes for a small attendance and for those having around 15 per night, or more, two instructors may be employed. We should stick pretty closely to the basic rate of \$1.50 per hour with some little allowance made in the hourly rate for good instructors who have much travel in getting to and from the classes. The area budget is the same as last year. Therefore, each class will be allowed approximately the same amount of money they used last year. At present no state funds will be approved for item 7 on the application (Replacement, Repair, etc.). If, at a later date, funds are available and classes need replacement or repair funds which cannot be supplied from other sources, supplements will be made not to exceed 10% of the total funds to the class.

Bear in mind that shop instructors may be employed especially for certain special classes in farm shop for veterans' classes only. The names of these instructors together with the proposed rate of pay and amount of time they shall devote should

appear on the application together with the names, rate of pay and hours of those instructors employed for regular adult farm machinery repair classes.

Make out the enclosed application in pencil, send it to me and I shall make the four copies necessary for the superintendent's signature, and you will receive the approved copy back from Richmond. If you desire to start the class immediately or before you get the approved copy back, you are authorized to begin with the assurance that instructors will be paid if the figures are in line with last year's. If there is any question about farm machinery repair classes, please write me.
