This Deed, made the 24 day of October

in the year 1882, between Samuel N. Brown, James H. Nichols and H. B. Holmes, constituting the School Board of Mt. Gilead District, of the County of Loudoun State of Virginia of the first part, and Levi White and Cynthia A. White his wife and of the County of Loudoun State of Virginia of the second part, witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of Seventy-five Dollars,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,

the said Levi White and Cynthia A. White

do grant and convey unto the said School District of Mt. Gilead, to be under the control of Said heirs and assigns forever: Samuel N. Brown, James H. Nichols and H. B. Holmes, now constituting the School Board of the Said School District, and their successors in office forever in fee simple, for public school purposes, a lot of land ~~not~~ being a part of that cut off from the farm of said White by the road from Janey and Bolyard Bell to the Grove (called the Mountain Road) and bounded as follows.

Beginning at a stone in one of Levi White's lines on the south side of the road before mentioned corner to Mr. Piggott and to E. J. Hoge, N. 14° E 14 1/4 rods, with the line of Said White to a stone to be planted now a heap of stones thence S. 59° E. 15 rods 1/7 links to a peg on north

of the County of Loudoun State of Virginia of the first part, and  
Levi White and Cynthia A. White  
his wife and of the County of Loudoun  
State of Virginia of the second part, witnesseth that in  
consideration of the sum of Seventy-five Dollars,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged

the said Levi White and Cynthia A. White

do grant and convey unto the said School District of  
Mt. Gilead, to be under the control of Said  
heirs and assigns forever: Samuel R. Brown, James W.  
Nichols and H. P. Holmes, now constituting  
the School Board of the Said School District,  
and their successors in office forever for  
fee simple, for public school purposes,  
a lot of land ~~not~~ being a part of that cut off  
from the farm of said White by the road from Jamey  
and Bolyard's Mill to the Grove (called the Mountain Road)  
and bounded as follows.

Beginning at a stone in one of Levi White's  
lines on the south side of the road before  
mentioned corner to Jno. Piggott and to E. J.  
Hage, N.  $14^{\circ} 6' 14\frac{1}{4}$  rods, with the line of Said  
White to a stone to be planted now a heap of Stones  
thence S.  $59^{\circ} 8'$  E. 15 rods 17 links to a peg on north  
side of the said Road, thence with said road  
S.  $86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$  12 3/4 rods & fourth last S.  $44^{\circ} W$  6 rods  
to beginning - containing about 1/2 acre.

Note - it is intended to mark all these corners with well planted  
stone at an early day. H. P. Holmes on behalf of School Board of Gilead Dist.

AND THE SAID Levi White & Cynthia ~~et his wife~~  
covenant that they will warrant generally, the property hereby conveyed, that  
they have the right to convey the same to the said grantee ; that the  
grantee shall have quiet possession thereof, free from all encumbrances,  
and that they will execute such further assurances of the same, as may be
